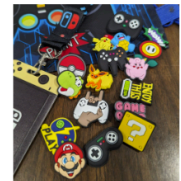
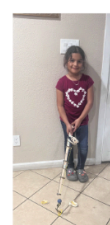
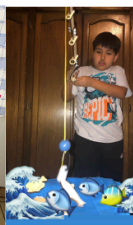

**March 6, 2024**

Call to order

#### 2. Minutes

We discussed and approved the minutes from our last meeting.

#### 3. Public Participation

- Coach Camilli will soon be ordering new uniforms for the student sports teams.
- The girls' basketball season has ended. They played hard, gave great effort, and came away with one win.
- Soccer Season will start soon. Mr. Bond, 6<sup>th</sup> grade teacher, will coach the team. We look forward to having this new sport on our campus.

#### 4. Old Business

- Shannon Hanen has been hired and started as our newest Office Tech. She brings with her a wealth of knowledge and a love for the students. Welcome Shannon!

- The speed hump on Laurel Lane has been put in place. We continue to wait for the placement of the 39<sup>th</sup> Ave. speed hump. We will discuss changes the speed hump has made to the traffic on Laurel Lane at our next meeting.
- Mrs. Gessner continues working on updating the Integrated Action Plan Goals for the upcoming school year, focusing on the needs of our students, staff, and families.

## 5. New Business

- We discussed the MTSS Updates, Multi-Tiered System of Support.
- Staff and Student Council members are invited to attend the District Board Meeting on Thursday March 14 at 6:30 to present “Why we are proud of Tumbleweed.” We look forward to this presentation.
- Krystal Crown reported on our school celebration of Read Across America in February. NJHS students from Cholla came and read to 2-3 grade classroom. Kathy Hoffman, former superintendent, was also on campus reading with classes. We had a DEAR time every day, (Drop Everything and Read). Students read in their classroom, under desks, in the garden, and on the playground. Mr. Maassen, librarian, had several activities in the library including a Dr. Seuss Silhouette Guessing Game and had Reading Goals set for every student. He gave away books galore to the top readers who had met their reading goal in each classroom. Student Council members presented a Readers Theater for K-3 classes and was thoroughly enjoyed by all. The ‘Read to Succeed’ Cart made its rounds giving away books and school supplies for those students who met their reading goals for the month of February.
- Congratulations to Rula Prock, Health Tech, on being the recipient of this years Lamp of Learning award. She was surprised with the announcement by being called to a ‘staged emergency’ where she was greeted by her family, staff, and students all cheering her on.
- Mrs. Gessner presented statistics on the Discipline and Attendance Data comparing last year to this year. At this point, our discipline incidents are down and our attendance is slightly above the district average.
- Ms Crown announces that AZELLA testing is complete. She and her staff tested 68 students.
