



March 5, 2025

#### Call to order

#### 1. Roll Call

## 2. Minutes

We discussed and approved the minutes from our last meeting.

## 3. Public Participation

- · Mr. Camilli reports the Girls Basketball Team has it's opening game tonight at Cholla Middle School. Good Luck Lady Tigers!
- · Latina Washington has been helping coach the team. The girls are showing improvement.

#### 4. Old Business

- Tumbleweed is in need of a 1:1 assistant. The position has been posted online and on the marquee.

#### 5. New Business

- Our attendance percentage rose slightly in February. We continue to have a higher percentage of our students in attendance than the district's average percentage. - · Mr. Gow and several 6<sup>th</sup> grade students have created a new video about 'Respect.' It was written by the 6<sup>th</sup> grade students and filmed by Mr. Gow. The video will be shown to all students next week.
- · Kindergarten Round-Up was very successful. We had 15 families attend.
- Student led parent/teacher conferences attracted 342 families. That's 82 more families than came in the fall.
- The Dream Bus visited Tumbleweed creating a lot of excitement for students selected to visit it. They received much needed clothing and shoes.
- The parking lots and bus bay areas will be reconfigured and reconstructed over the summer.

#### 6. ASA Updates

• Tumbleweed has submitted the grant for the 21st Century Community Learning Center, requesting we receive the funds necessary to continue our ASA program

for the next five years. Notification of that grant submission is posted on our marquee.
