Call to order

The regular meeting of the Tumbleweed Site Council began at 3:33 pm on Nov. 2, 2022.

1. Roll Call

The following members were present: Kim Gessner, Anne Barsness, Rula Prock, Brian Camilli, and Erika Seeley.

2. Minutes

We discussed and approved the minutes from our last meeting.

3. Public Participation

Mr. Camilli reports that this years' Turkey Trot will follow the same schedule as last year. Students will come and run during their specials' time. There will be winners for each grade level.

4. Old Business

- Tumbleweed has hired a long-term sub, Mrs. Fox, to teach 5<sup>th</sup> grade through the remainder of the 2022-23 school year. Parents were advised of the change via email two days before the change was made. Mrs. Fox spent time in each of the 5<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms so the students had a chance to meet her before the classes were divided.
- Tumbleweed still has openings for a 6<sup>th</sup> Grade teacher and a Social Worker.
- We currently need six more signatures on the approval form for the speed hump installation.

5. New Business

- Perfect attendance certificates are being awarded at an assembly to students in 4-6 grades for 1<sup>st</sup> quarter attendance.
- 'Move on When Reading' letters were sent home today to update families on their students' progress.
- Parent/Teacher conferences were well attended.

6. ASA

- Love Our Schools was a great success. There were twelve volunteers from Sprouts, and four volunteers from TU on campus. We cleaned the garden plots, organized the garden shed, did a general school-wide clean up, and watered our baby trees.

- Master gardeners from the “Blue Watermelon Project” came to campus and visited with Mrs. Prock about our garden. They were encouraging and offered advice on how to be effective with our garden area.

- PTO’s Halloween Bash at Peter Piper Pizza was a great success. Students came dressed in costume and participated in games. Funds were raised by PTO.
- There is a new Kona Ice vendor. Changing the Kona Ice day to after school worked well.
