

Best first instruction (Tier 1) along with small group intervention (Tier 1 and 2) will increase overall student proficiency in 3rd-6th grade AASA 2025 Math by 3% from 22% to 25% with individual levels of proficiency by grade level:

3rd - 31% to 34% - 3% increase

4th - 22% to 27% - 5% increase

5th - 22% to 25% - 3% increase

6th - 10% to 15% - 5% increase

ELA

Best first instruction (Tier 1) along with small group intervention (Tier 1 and 2) will increase overall student proficiency in 3rd-6th grade AASA 2025 ELA by 3% from 28% to 31% with individual levels of proficiency by grade level:

3rd - 22% to 27% - 5% increase

4th - 32% to 35% - 3% increase

5th - 26% to 30% - 4% increase

6th - 33% to 36% - 3% increase



Meeting Minutes

Nov. 6, 2024

Call to order

The regular meeting of the Tumbleweed Site Council began at 3:31 pm on Nov. 6, 2024.

1. Roll Call

The following members were present: Kim Gessner, Krystal Crown, Rula Prock, Traci Auten, Brian Camilli, Erika Seeley, and Cristina Martinez.

2. Minutes

We discussed and approved the minutes from our last meeting.

3. Public Participation

- Fall Sports-Boys Basketball is in action! The team has already participated in intramural games and the event went well. Dates for the Division 1 tournaments are Nov. 20, 22, and 23. The boys are learning skills of the game as well as good sportsmanship.
- · Cross Country has flourished under the coaching efforts of Ms. Hamblen. Practice sessions are well organized beginning with a 10-minute warm up, followed with a run, and finishing up with a game for the team to build trust and partnership with each other. There will be a Practice District Meet at ASU West, dates to be determined.

4. Old Business

- Tumbleweed is losing Mr. Hildebrand. He is moving out of state and will be missed. Two Title 1 Para Pro's have been hired to take his place and teach in Tigerland. The transition will take place at the end of November.
- The Read to Succeed Cart continues to be a popular incentive for student achievement. Data shows that there is increased reading activity throughout all grade levels.
- · IAP data shows growth by students in both Math and ELA.

5. New Business

- · Parent/Teacher Conferences took place early in October. A total of 88% of our families met with their children's teachers, 81% of them met in person.
- Our attendance is hovering around 93%, we are hoping to get back to at least 95% of our students here on time each day. We are going to target our chronically tardy students by requiring them to sit out for part of their morning or afternoon recess, hopefully this will encourage them to be on time to school.
- We discussed the behavior trends so far this year. Data shows that referrals are decreasing and interventions in place are working.
- Student Council sold 200 'Boo Grams' to earn money and encourage friendships and bonding among students.
- We had a successful Love Our Schools Day, with many staff, students, and parents alongside of our faith-based partners at Christ's Community Church on hand to clean up and beautify our campus.
- Monica Paredes was selected as one of the districts Employee of the Month recipients. Congratulations to Monica!

6. ASA Updates

• This session we have two reading classes, two math classes, and two enrichment classes. We are at the end of our 5-year grant. Next session will begin in January and target those students needing intervention enrichment experiences.

7. Upcoming Events

- · Our annual Turkey Trot will be held Nov. 27.
