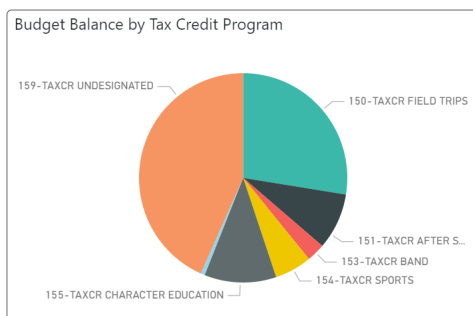

Meeting Minutes

Jan. 4, 2023

Call to order

The regular meeting of the Tumbleweed Site Council began at 3:32 pm on Jan. 4, 2023.

1. Roll Call

The following members were present: Kim Gessner, Anne Barsness, Rula Prock, Brian Camilli, and Erika Seeley.

2. Minutes

We discussed and approved the minutes from our last meeting.

3. Public Participation

Mr. Camilli requested input for this year's Field Day. Parents will be invited and encouraged to attend. Field Day lasts between 2 ½ and 3 hours with rotating activities throughout the morning. Ms Seeley will check with Kona Ice to see if they are scheduled to come.

4. Old Business

- We have a new 6th Grade Teacher, Josh Bond, who will start on Jan. 5th with his new class.
- The reading incentive for January is “Reading is Snow Much Fun!” Students will be encouraged to spend time reading and will be able to choose an incentive from the Coupon/Prize Card at the end of the month if they have reached their reading goal.
- The speed cushions were approved and paid for. However, due to upcoming construction on 39th Ave. the speed cushion on that street will be significantly delayed. The speed cushion on Laurel Lane should be installed within 180 days of the city receiving our payment.

5. New Business

- The CNA, Comprehensive Needs Assessment, has been completed. Mrs. Gessner and Mrs. Barsness will now follow up by determining where improvement is needed, what our focus needs to be, submitting their ideas to the Leadership Team, then to District for final approval before submitting our plan to the State Board.
- Undesignated Tax Credits were discussed. Many classrooms still need desks and chairs. Mrs. Gessner will have a list of needs prepared for discussion at our next Site Council meeting.

6. ASA

Mrs. Prock reports that ASA is in the early stages of preparation for this semesters' ASA classes. Ms Encinas is working to secure teachers and staff. Classes will begin on January 23.

7. PTO

The FundRaiser clothing/soft household good drive is coming to a close. The last day for donations is Jan. 13th. The Grand Prize drawing for the Big Kona Birthday Party will be on Jan. 17th.

Ms. Seeley requested ideas for Teacher Appreciation Week. Mrs. Gessner will check with the Leadership Committee for suggestions.
