## Every Student Deserves a Team!

We have been presented with some challenges but with the support of parents and staff, we were able to ensure a safe environment for our

students and staff. The lesson is if you hear something, say something. It has been a pleasure being the principal in this community the last three weeks. I've been impressed with our teachers as they are jumping into the curriculum, aligning to district expectations and my expectations, and working as a team. They are working with their grade level team tackling minor behaviors and working with their content area teams planning to ensure every student is getting quality instruction and care. Please set aside some time to talk to your children about school safety and the importance of reporting anything they may hear or see that could put our campus at risk.

We also have a responsibility to educate our students about things that should never be said at school or about a school that puts students, staff and the community at risk. Sometimes students do not realize the severity of making a threatening comment and will brush it off as they were joking. It is important as parents to have these conversations at home. Mountain Sky and the WESD take comments of a threatening nature very seriously. Parents can help by having conversations with their children about certain threatening statements that should never be said at school and if their child hears something of a threatening nature, they need to report it. We appreciate your support and collaboration to provide a safe environment for Mountain Sky.

#### <u>Updates and Information</u> Staffing

On Monday, Ms. Reyes will join us as the .5 ELA teacher and work with our temporary sub who has been here since day one. We thank Ms. Clark for maintaining the three classes she's been covering while we work on finding a permanent person.

We have made the recommendation to hire a .5 choir teacher. We have submitted all the requirements and are waiting on the District to finalize and provide us a start date. We appreciate the patience and understanding as we have been working diligently to get someone in that role as we want to continue and grow our choir program.

#### **Schedule Changes**

Since we are heading into week four and quickly approaching progress reports, we will no longer be making any schedule changes. Students need consistency and we have a responsibility to maintain their regular schedules moving forward to build a sense of community with the teachers and students within their teams.

#### **Student IDs**

Students are required to wear them on the front of their person, whether it is by a lanyard or in another way that keeps it on the front of their shirt, so it is visible to all staff members at all times. Students who forget their ID will get a temporary ID. Temporary IDs do need to be returned. However, students that continually forget their IDs will be charged \$2 for a new one and given consequences for not being responsible with the requirement. Consequences will start to be put in place for students who are forgetting their IDs weekly. We will contact parents and arrange for before or after-school detentions as needed.

#### **Tardies**

Students should know their schedules at this point. The schoolwide expectation is that students must be in their classrooms by the end of the last bell. At this point, students should no longer be tardy to their classes. Students who are being documented for multiple tardies throughout the week or even within one day will receive parent contact and potential consequences of before or after-school detention. Please remind them that their priority is to get from class to class and not stop to socialize during passing. Students can do that before school, at lunch and after school.

Let's be present and powerful each day, and make attendance a priority this school year! We appreciate your support!


