#AttendanceMattersWESD

As part of the #AttendanceMattersWESD campaign, our school is proud to continue spreading awareness on the importance of attendance! The theme for this year is Be Present, Be Powerful. It is a call for everyone to focus on ensuring students show up to school every day, even when it is not easy. In case you missed it, the WESD achieved an attendance rate of 92.07% for the 2023-2024 school year, which is an increase of 0.12% from the previous year. Additionally, the WESD reduced chronic absenteeism by 14%. The WESD strives to increase student attendance again while also reducing chronic absenteeism even more this school year – but we need your help!

Please help us in our efforts by making sure your child attends school each day and is on time. Remember, every day a student is absent is a lost opportunity for learning! Both unexcused and excused absences also count towards chronic absenteeism, which is typically defined as missing 10% of the school year — or just two days each month — for any reason. Chronic absenteeism can cause students to fall behind in school and affect their academic success.

Below are some tips for you to help your child achieve perfect attendance.

- · Set a regular bedtime and morning routine for your child.
- \cdot Lay out your child's clothes and pack their backpack the night before.
- · Keep your child healthy by ensuring they receive their required vaccines.
- \cdot Schedule medical appointments for your child after school hours or on the weekends.
