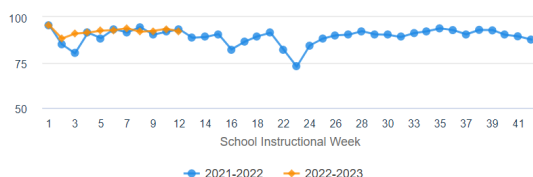

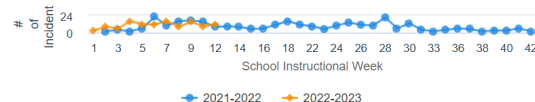

Oct. 5, 2022

Call to order

The regular meeting of the Tumbleweed Site Council began at 2:30 pm on Oct. 5, 2022.

1. Roll Call

2. Minutes

We discussed and approved the minutes from our last meeting.

3. Public Participation

4. Old Business

- Tumbleweed still has two open positions for teachers for 5th and 6th Grade.

Students had a great time learning some new skills.

6. ASA

- Kiwanis Dollar Wars ended. Our school collected \$2535.00 for Kiwanis and we will receive 80% of those funds for our use. Classroom popcorn parties are underway this week for those classes from each grade level who brought in the highest percentage of money per student. Friday Oct. 7 we will hold a school-wide assembly where the students from Ms. Andrade's classroom will decorate her with chocolate syrup, sprinkles, marshmallows, nuts and cherries. Their class donated the highest percentage of dollars per students.
