### Integrated Action Plan 24-25

#### Math

- Best first instruction (Tier 1) along with small group intervention (Tier 1 and 2) will increase overall student proficiency in 3rd-6th grade AASA 2025 Math by 3% from 22% to 25% with individual levels of proficiency by grade level:  
3rd - 31% to 34% - 3% increase  
4th - 22% to 27% - 5% increase

5th - 22% to 25% - 3% increase

6th - 10% to 15% - 5% increase

## ELA

- Best first instruction (Tier 1) along with small group intervention (Tier 1 and 2) will increase overall student proficiency in 3rd-6th grade AASA 2025 ELA by 3% from 28% to 31% with individual levels of proficiency by grade level:

3rd - 22% to 27% - 5% increase

4th - 32% to 35% - 3% increase

5th - 26% to 30% - 4% increase

6th - 33% to 36% - 3% increase

## Family Engagement - Climate & Culture

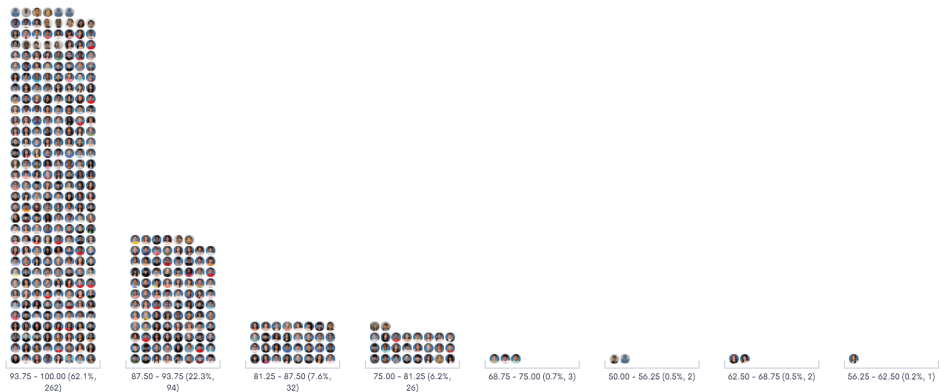

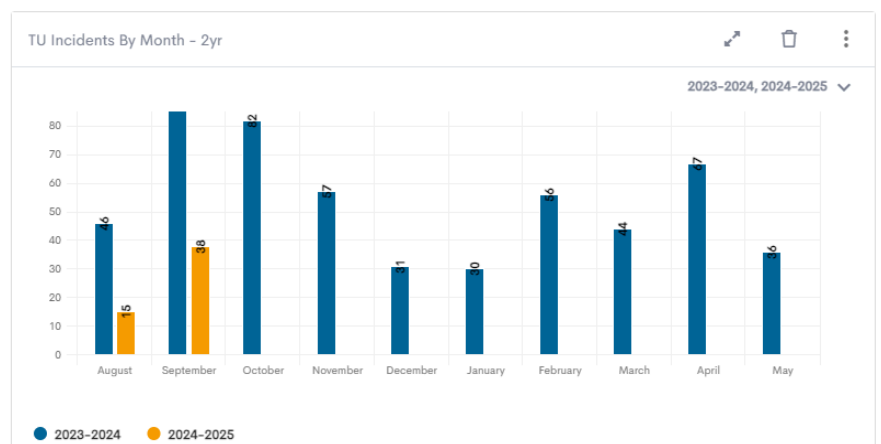

### Meeting Minutes

**Sept. 11, 2024**

**Call to order**

The regular meeting of the Tumbleweed Site Council began at 3:32 pm on Sept. 11, 2024.

**1. Roll Call**

The following members were present: Kim Gessner, Krystal Crown, Rula Prock, Traci Auten, Erika Seeley, and Cristina Martinez.

**2. Minutes**

We discussed and approved the minutes from our last meeting.

**3. Public Participation**

- Fall Sports-Boys Basketball Try-Outs are happening next week. Mr. Camilli will be coaching again this year. He plans to have 18-20 players on the team. 4<sup>th</sup> Grade boys will be allowed to try out and participate in practices to develop skills needed to play in the games next year. Most games will be Intramural throughout the district. There will be one or two regional games, including the traditional Charger Classic tournament.
- Cross Country-Laura Hamblen will be coaching Cross Country this year. She comes with experience in running sports. Practices for those students wanting to participate will begin later this month.
- Soccer is tentative at this point.

**4. Old Business**

- Tumbleweed is fully staffed!
- The Read to Succeed Cart continues to be a popular incentive for student achievement. Some of the new coupons that students can choose are “Buddy Reader”, where students may choose a book and read to their class. The Gardening Coupon will allow students a 30-minute time period to work in our school garden.
- We reviewed the Integrated Action Plan statistics from last year. We are now designated as a ‘support school.’ Our growth and proficiency points have dropped. We enjoyed a lively discussion on the cause of that downward trend and what plans are in place to increase those points. The district is providing our school with extra coaches who have been invited to monitor, observe, coach, provide feedback to teachers. The coaches are in the classrooms looking for visual learning targets. They are helping and encouraging teachers to be more thoughtful in their presentations of learning tools for students. Ms. Gessner shared with us the ‘Who, What, When, Where, Why Plan’ that has been implemented.

**5. New Business**

- The month of August attendance was up significantly from last year. Referrals were significantly down from the same time last year. We discussed how we will continue to keep these trends going in the right direction.
- District visitors will be on campus 09/19/24 to announce Super Kids and Super Staff. We look forward to their visit.

## **6. ASA Updates**

- **Ms Ashenbrener is our ASA Director for this year. She has a great staff and engaging classes planned for this first session. We are in the 5<sup>th</sup> year of our ASA Grant. Ms. Gessner plans to apply for a new grant to continue this great program on our campus.**

## **7. Upcoming Events**

- **Math Night will be held Sept. 19<sup>th</sup> from 4:00 – 5:30. Families will be invited to come to campus and engage in fun activities.**
- **Safe Route to School returns this year on Oct. 30<sup>th</sup>. Moon Valley High School will supply extra fun and entertainment for this event using their Band to play and energize the crowd as we learn safety skills.**
