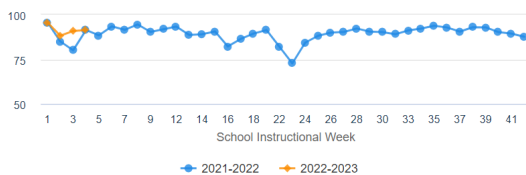

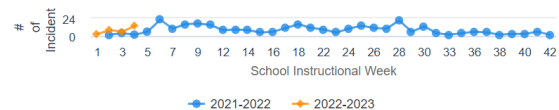

Meeting Minutes

Aug. 17, 2022

Call to order

The regular meeting of the Tumbleweed Site Council began at 3:33 pm on Aug. 17, 2022.

1. Roll Call

The following members were present: Kim Gessner, Rula Prock, Brian Camilli, Anne Barsness, Richard Morris, Holly Gushwa, and Erika Seeley. Members present spent a moment introducing themselves.

2. Minutes

We discussed and approved the minutes from our last meeting.

3. Public Participation

Cross Country should be starting soon. A possible plan is for individual meets at each school and a few larger meets to take place at ASU West. Michelle Ingersol will be leading the coaching duties.

4. Old Business

- Tax credits have been spent on furniture for classrooms. Items such as small desks, trapezoid tables, and student tables have been purchased.
- At this point, Tumbleweed is fully staffed. However, class sizes are large and are being evaluated for an extra class in grades 2, 5, and 6. The district will help with the staffing of those classes once the need is confirmed. We discussed the teacher to student ratio currently in place for the WESD.
- Mrs. Gessner has obtained maps outlining the placement of the speed cushions that are approved by the city. Our next steps are to get the signatures needed by community members impacted by the placement of those speed humps. We plan to go out and get signatures at our next Site Council meeting.

5. New Business

- “Read to Succeed”! TU Tigers are encouraged to be reading every day. Classrooms have been offered incentives to get students reading because, “The more minutes you spend reading, the better reader you become.” Classroom doors have reading posters on them, and students place stickers on the posters as they complete their daily reading assignments. At the end of the month, those classes who have met their goals will be rewarded with a popcorn party. This program helps to promote and build a love of reading among our students.
- Our school-wide discipline plan continues to show promise and student referrals are still few in number. Students who have having trouble with behavior

are continuing to learn as staff and teachers continue to help promote responsible and respectful behavior from students. Our one school rule focuses on safety and learning. "Tumbleweed is a place where everyone has the right to learn and be safe in a kind and positive environment. By following our ROARS this can be achieved." Our focus is to be kind and be positive.

- Attendance and being at school on time is being heavily emphasized on announcements and in classrooms to help students continue to have success in their educational endeavors.
- Safety is a big priority. We have started the school year with one fire drill and one lock down drill during each of the first two weeks. Our Crisis Team is being assembled and will meet soon.
- Kona Ice is coming to campus to begin a fundraising program. Students may purchase a Kona Ice during their lunch recess.

6. ASA

Yvonne Encinas is our Site Coordinator this year for ASA. Rula Prock continues on as Outreach Specialist Classes will be starting in September.

7. PTO

PTO plans to work towards their goal of providing more sports equipment and play areas on campus. The first PTO meeting will be held Monday, Aug. 22.
