• Student Enrollment: 696 students

• Student Attendance: Attendance yearly rate is: 88%;

- Data Amber Landis & Jennifer Griggs-
  - September data chronic absenteeism 44.4% includes those who are quarantined or ill; discipline incidents for Aug & Sept. 244, one student has 15 incidents as repeat offender, classroom and aggression two highest categories, 1<sup>st</sup> grade is the grade level of need, trying to provide resources for families within and outside the district
  - Assessment data 80 new students since August, the data reflects only those student who were here previously and are current students; 18-19 minimally proficient has growth of 10%, teachers are seeing growth so keep doing what you are doing; 2% of WA students have been impacted by COVID, 38% of teachers opted out for masks so that they could not wear mask when alone in classroom and 1% of students have opted at WA.

 VIP - pleased to announce to Site Council; represent business all along 27<sup>th</sup> Avenue corridor; great relationship between VIP and WESD with Jenn Griggs and Pam Horton on committee, plan has been developed for 27th Avenue called 27th Avenue To Do List; on list is assets and WESD is listed as asset, VIP started in 2014 called Violence Impact Project to combat crime along the Avenue and got crime down quite a bit and community took over in 2016 by the VIP Coalition; continue to work on problems with city and neighborhoods, went to city to create a vision and plan and those items that are of importance we go to city with; old parcel behind school is the old Kmart; called owners and began having conversations with city and owner and now it is likely that a trade school will be housed there. WestMec with Maricopa County Community College, and ASU to offer CTE, want to create safe affordable housing, training for better jobs, good schools, secured 14.5 million from federal government for the property, hotels are being created as apartments, issue of homelessness has become a large problem and city council developed an 8pt plan to battle the issue to create smaller shelters across the valley, city council sponsored COVID shelter for elderly had 0 crime rate, people won't be able to come and go other than official visitors, trying to work on Super 8 Hotel and Village In restaurant so city is now working to demolish building so that they will be cleaned up, link to VIP plan update put in chat box and the homelessness update report also in link, Coalition working on QT and amount of calls being received by police now on security will be at all of the QTs on 27th Avenue as 40 people will be hired and provided military type training so combat stealing, some bus stops are being removed to combat loitering, police have been working the bus

stops by arresting drug dealers and criminals as drug and shootings have been taking place in front of Washington Elementary School in the last few months, city clean up for 19<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> Avenue as well as Northern Avenue, looking for volunteers, making a difference by creating networks like meeting Alejandro and Priscilla at VIP meeting, open time for questions,
